The Functions of the Executive is a book by Chester I. Barnard (1886–1961) that presents a "theory of cooperation and organization" and "a study of the functions and of the methods of operation of executives in formal organizations." :xi-xii It was originally published in 1938; a Thirtieth Anniversary edition, published in 1968, is still in print. The book is notable for its focus on how organizations actually operate, instead of previous approaches to organizations that emphasized "prescriptive Public Administration plays a key role in organizing society; it is also a very important factor in the progress and regress of the economy and society itself.
