

One Hundred Poets, One Poem Each: A Translation of the Ogura Hyakunin Isshu, 2008, Peter McMillan, Columbia University Press, 2008, 9780231512923, 240 pages

English: This illustrated book of Ogura hyakunin isshu (One hundred poets, one hundred poems) is a collection of one hundred 31-syllable classical Japanese poems (waka), each by a different poet. The collection is organized chronologically from Emperor Tenji (626-671) to Emperor Juntoku (1197-1242). Each of the poets is depicted by a woodblock print created by Hishikawa Moronobu (1618-circa 1694). Morobonu is often considered the first Ukiyo-e artist. Picture books; Poetry. Hyakunin isshu can be translated to "one hundred people, one poem \[each\]"; it can also refer to the card game of uta-garuta, which uses a deck composed of cards based on the Ogura Hyakunin Isshu. It was compiled by Fujiwara no Teika while he lived in the Ogura district of Kyoto, Japan.\[1\].
