The Magic Tree House series is an award-winning series of children's books written by American author Mary Pope Osborne. In the first series, consisting of the first 28 books, Morgan le Fay sends Jack and Annie, two normal children from Frog Creek, Pennsylvania, on numerous adventures and missions with a magical tree house in order to help free Morgan from a spell, solve four ancient riddles to become Master Librarians, and save four ancient stories from being lost forever. After the twenty-eighth chapter book, Mary Pope Osborne started a second series called the Magic Tree House "Me Magic Tree House Series. 57 primary works & 109 total works. Fantasy for children ages 5-8. In 2017 the Merlin Missions were republished as an independent series with new numbering. What was book #29 "Christmas in Camelot" is now #1 of the Merlin Missions and so forth. In 2017 a new book 29 "Big Day for Baseball" was published under the Magic Tree House series. To avoid confusion all Merlin Mission books have been renumbered. More. Magic Tree House is an American fantasy series by Mary Pope Osborne. The books have done very well, having been translated into over thirty languages. In 2011, Aija-do animation works produced the first film based on the series. I'll be completely honest, I haven't read these books. I'm not going to know if the film version stays true to the original. I'll be looking purely at how well it stands on its own. With that in mind, let's take a look at Magic Tree House. Story: We open with a sorceress helping some children in a library. The Magic Tree House series is a series written by Mary Pope Osborne, which started in 1992. Sal Murdocca illustrated every single book. Since, then, there have been 54 books published. There are seventeen Magic Tree House Research Guides to act as non-fiction companions to only some books. William Osborne, Mary's husband, is a co-author of all the research guides.
