The book consists of three sections: instructions in poetic form, outline of Bujutsu principles and the systematic description of techniques provided with illustrations. The contents of the book covers a wide range of issues: from religious and philosophical aspects of budo and the foundations of martial strategy to the nuances of individual techniques.
