In September 1775, Allen led a failed attempt on Montreal which resulted in his capture by British authorities. They eventually decided to collaborate on a book intended as an attack on organized religion, as Young had convinced Allen to become a Deist. They worked on the manuscript until 1764, when Young moved away from the area taking the manuscript with him.[20] Allen recovered the manuscript many years later, after Young's death.
