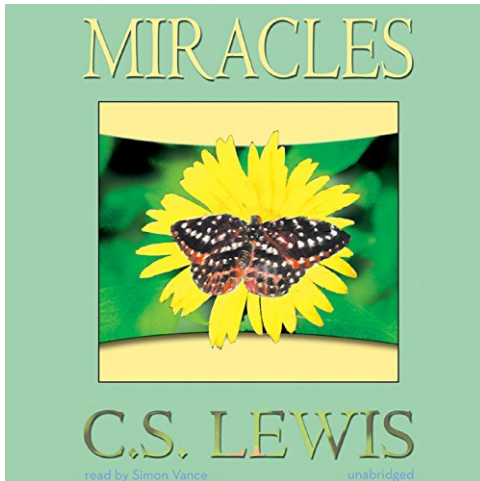

Miracles. The term "miracle" is used very broadly in ordinary language. A quick review of news stories may turn up reports such as that of a "Christmas Miracle," by which the Texas gulf coast came to be blanketed with snow by a rare storm. We speak of miracle drugs, or of miracle babies, and some household products purport to be miraculous as well. The outcome of any discussion of miracles seems to depend greatly on our worldview. Miracles are unexpected events attributed to divine activities or intentions, sometimes thought of as perceptible interruptions of the laws of nature.
