However, due to his own exaggerated storytelling, his real achievements have been masked by lure and legend. Captain John Smith was born in late 1579 or early 1580. The exact date is not clear. He was born in a farmer family in Willoughby, England. He did his studies in Alford and he stopped his studies after his father died. His father died in 1596, when he was just 16.
